



The adult Sunday school class will begin studying the book The Pietist Option, Hope for the Renewal of Christianity. The book is authored by Christopher Gehrz, a university professor and Mark Pattie III, a church pastor.

Pietism was a church renewal movement of the late seventeenth century. John Wesley, the founder of Methodism, met some of those in the movement during his voyage to America to do missionary work. While he did not take part in the movement, there were several parts of the movement he found helpful.

John Fea, of Messiah College, has this to say about the book: In an age in which the church is badly divided by politics and cultural wars, The by loving our neighbors, living in hope, and listening to God.

January Mission of the Month



We are collecting a mission offering for Mutual Ground to help them continue living into their mission:

To empower individuals, families, and communities to eliminate domestic and sexual violence and the harms of substance use through education, awareness, and life-changing services.

Mutual Ground is located at 418 Oak Avenue in Aurora. The organization serves families and individuals impacted by domestic and sexual violence and substance use disorders. It also provides school-based prevention programs designed to educate and empower students experiencing domestic and sexual abuse.

Numbers from the last fiscal year reflect the impact of Mutual Ground:

50,000+ students received prevention education

7,643 nights of shelter provided to 206 adults and children

1,291 hours of substance use recovery services provided

1,279 adults and children received domestic and/or sexual violence services 258 orders of protection were filed with the help of legal advocates

108 calls from local hospital ERs were responded to by volunteers and Staff 100 % of your donation goes directly to support the services of Mutual Ground.
